

Notice of Emergency Public Meeting Of the Alaska Board of Game

Notice is given that the Alaska Board of Game will meet by teleconference on Wednesday, **July 28, 2010 at 1:30 p.m.** The purpose of the meeting is to consider regulatory changes necessitated by a judicial decision dated July 9, 2010 in the Manning, et al v. State, et al, litigation, 3KN -09-178CI. Regulatory changes to subsistence hunting for moose and caribou and the Tier II subsistence hunting permit point system for Unit 13 will be addressed. The board will also consider regulatory changes to the Gulkana, Cantwell, Chistochina, Gakona, Mentasta, Tazlina, Chitina, and Kluti Kaah Community Harvest Permit for moose and caribou.
