<u>CA</u>	3	Modify the season and bag limit for moose in Unit 18 Remainder and Lower Yukon Area. (Amended with substitute language, RC 17, which combined the Lower Yukon hunt Area with the Unit 18 Remainder, and modified the seasons and liberalized bag limits for residents as: August 1 - September 30, two moose, one of which may be antlered bull; a person may not take a calf or a cow accompanied by a calf October 1 - November 30, two antlerless moose December 1 - March 15, two moose Non-resident season and bag limits remained the same: September 1 - September 30; one antlered bull)

Teshekpuk Lake caribou herd; establish amounts reasonably necessary for subsistence. (*The board took no action due to adoption of separate motions for a positive C&T use finding and an ANS (amount reasonably necessary for subsistence) to be included with the ANS of 8,000 – 12,000 already established for the Western Arctic caribou herd.*)

<u>C</u> 24 Change the hunting season and bag limit for coyote in Unit 26A to a no closed season and no bag limit.

Kotzebue Area - Unit 23

- <u>CA</u> 25 Change the Noatak River musk ox hunt area boundary to include the entire Noatak drainage and all areas north and west of the Kobuk River drainage. (The board amended the proposal to modify the established C&T finding to align with the hunt area in the proposal.)
- <u>C</u> 26 Reauthorize antlerless moose seasons in Unit 23.
- <u>CA</u> 27 Modify brown bear harvest in Unit 23 on lands managed by the National Park Service. (*The board amended the proposal to adopt a nonresident registration hunt, and remove the original language.*)
- <u>C</u> 28 Change the hunting season and bag limit for coyote in Unit 23 to a no closed season and no limit.
- <u>F</u> 29 Allow the sale of caribou antlers harvested in Unit 23.

Regional and Multiple Units

- <u>F</u> 30 Open resident sheep seasons ten days before nonresident seasons in Region V.
- F 31 Open resident sheep seasons seven days before nonresident seasons in Region V.
- <u>F</u> 32 Create a bowhunting only season for Dall sheep in Region V.
- NA 33 Change nonresident sheep hunts to drawing hunts and limit permit distribution to ten percent of the annual ten year average in Region V.
- <u>NA</u> 34 Allocate a small percent of game harvest for nonresidents in Unit 26.
- <u>F</u> 35 Prohibit the use of snares to take bears in Region V.
- NA 36 Allocate 90% of drawing permits to residents in Region V.
- NA 37 Allocate 90% of drawing permits to residents in Region V.

<u>C</u> 38 Reauthorize the current resident tag fee exemption for brown bear in Units 18, 22, 23 and 26A.

Miscellaneous Actions

The board considered, but did not adopt positive findings for customary and traditional (C&T) uses of musk ox for Unit 18, Nelson Island, and Nunivak Island.

The board considered, but took no action on a finding for customary and traditional use for grouse in Unit 18.

The board adopted findings (RC 30) directly AD&G to discretionary authority to issue Unit 23 nonresident registration brow bear permits in Kotzebue only.

The board adopted a positive C&T finding for the Teshekpuk Lake caribou herd, and modified the ANS (amount reasonably necessary for subsistence) for the Western Arctic caribou herd (8,000 - 12,000) to include the Teshekpuk Lake caribou herd.

The board scheduled two board generated proposals for the Statewide Regulations meeting scheduled for March 2014 concerning the topics of:

- Musk ox hunting on Nelson Island, and
- The use of snow machines to track and pursue wolves and wolverine.

The board considered two emergency petitions concerning: 1) musk ox hunting permits for Nelson Island, and 2) moose hunting in Unit 17C. The board found that neither petition met the emergency criteria as defined in the Joint Board Petition Policy, 5 AAC 96.625.
