


### **BROWN BEAR**


- Variable distribution in Unit

# Unit 1C Brown Bear Harvest 2004-2013








#### SITKA BLACK-TAILED DEER

- Most abundant on islands; present on mainland
- Significant winter mortality 2006-2007
- Proposal 10, 17




#### Unit 1C Deer Harvest 2004-2013




# Douglas Island Pellet Transects 2004-2013

#### **Gustavus Bull Moose Hunt**

- > Any bull (through 2008)
  - Difficult to manage
  - Season length ranged from 30 days to 6 hours
- > RY2009: antler restriction
  - 2009: 14 bulls & 30 days
  - 2010: 13 bulls & 20 days
  - 2011: 8 bulls & 30 Days
  - 2012: 9 bulls & 30 days
  - 2013: 13 bulls & 18 days
  - 2014: 11 bulls & 30 days
- > 11% success (2009-2014)




#### **Berners Bay Moose Hunts**


- > Any bull drawing permit
  - 6-10 permits annually (98-06)
    - 85% success
  - 5 permits (2014)
    - 80% success
- Antlerless drawing permit
  - 2-10 permits (not issued every year)
  - 91% success
- Multiple severe winters beginning in 2006/2007 led to population decline











## Berners Bay Moose Harvest 2000-2006








    - 29% success
  - > 87% of harvest is male goats

#### UNIT 1C MOUNTAIN GOAT MANAGEMENT OVERVIEW

- Goat hunts are managed by registration & drawing permits
- ➤ There are four registration permit hunts and one drawing permit hunt in Unit 1(C)...these have varying season dates
  - RG012 Oct. 1-Nov. 30
  - RG013 Aug. 1-Nov. 30
  - RG014 Aug. 1-Nov. 30 (archery only)
  - RG015 Sept. 1-Nov. 30
  - DG011 Oct. 1-Nov. 30
- Allowable harvest determined by aerial survey








### **FURBEARERS**

- Primarily recreational trappers
  - 26 trappers seal furs annually
- Increased coyote sightings
- Increased wolf sign/sightings on mainland and Douglas Island
- Public outreach



### Discussion

- Current regulations in effect since 1991
- Proxy hunting contributes to additive harvest
- Successful hunters avg. just 1 deer/season on all islands combined
  - Shelter Is.1.3 deer/ successful hunter
  - Lincoln Is.0.8 deer/ successful hunter
  - Sullivan Is.1.4 deer/ successful hunter
- Opportunity exists for most hunters to harvest more deer under existing regulations








### **Hunt Conditions**

- Unit 1C ...1 goat by registration permit
  - RG012 October 1- November 30
  - RG013 August 1- November 30
  - RG014 August 1- November 30 ......(Archery-only)
  - RG015 September 1- November 30
- The taking of nannies with kids prohibited
- Harvest must be reported within 5 days of kill





### RG014 Archery-only area

- Between Mt. Bullard and Taku Inlet, 44% of surveyed mtn. goats are already within the RG014 boundary
- Accessible by several trails off the road system, and boat
- GHL = 5 points per year (2004-2013)
  - Additional opportunity likely in 2015 based survey results
    - 8 hunters/ year
    - 2 points harvested annually
    - RG014 hunt has never closed early
- Existing archery-only opportunity in RG014 hunt area is underutilized

### Viewing and Recreation

- Mtn. goats can be readily viewed around Juneau and are extremely popular with local residents and tourists
  - ~1 million cruise ship, and ~ 20,000 independent tourists (2013)
- Additional hunting may increase user conflicts in some areas
- Juneau trail systems allow easy access to goat habitat


- If the Board chooses to provide additional archery opportunity, the department recommends amending this proposal
  - Replace drawing hunt with registration hunt
  - Extend RG014 boundary towards town
    - Access considerations
    - Goat viewing



#### Discussion

- Blackerby Ridge would allow a couple extra points.
  - Additional interest could potentially cause this to close quickly by EO due to easy access.
  - Mt. Roberts, Mt. Juneau, and Thunder Mtn. would be retained for viewing opportunity








### Berners Bay Anterless Moose Hunting

- Antlerless hunt used to maintain moose population at levels consistent with available habitat
- When hunt occurs, its by drawing permit only Sept.
   15 Oct. 15
- 0 to 10 antlerless permits issued (1998-2006)
- Avg. harvest: 5 antlerless moose/year (1998-2006, when hunt occurred)
- Berner's Bay moose hunts very popular with public


# **DM042 Permits & Harvest 1998-2006**






#### Discussion

- Limited bull moose hunt reinitiated in fall 2014 (5 bull permits issued)




# **Gustavus Antlerless Moose Harvest 2002-2008**

#### **Unit 1D Mountain Goat Harvest**

- The Tukgahgo Mtn. area was historically reserved as a hunt primarily intended for youth
- Relatively Easy Access
  - Haines Highway
  - 7 mile trail
- Annual GHL = 1 point
  - Herd vulnerable to overharvest
  - Avg. 2 goats harvested/ year (2004-2013)
    - (upwards of 3-5 points taken in some years)
- Tukgahgo Mtn. hunt typically closed by EO within 1-5 days of opener





Proposed mergers would increase goat hunting opportunity in portions of the Upper Chilkat Valley where additional harvest opportunity exists, but is rarely utilized during the existing season dates


#### **Issue Statement**

  - Setting up bait sites next to brown bear hunting camps

- Current baiting season: April 15- June 15
- Must be at least 16 years old
- Successfully complete a ADFG approved bear baiting clinic
  - Available online
- Register bait stations with ADFG
  - Physical description
  - GPS location
- Clearly mark site with signs


Unit 1D Black Bear Harvest

- Avg. 32 bears/yr (2004-2013)
  - 25M:7F
- Avg. 12 bears/yr taken over bait
  - 10M:2F
  - 38% of total harvest
- 86% of annual harvest occurs in spring (May 1-June 30)
  - Majority of harvest over bait occurs last week of May



#### Discussion

- May alleviate conflicts between black bear baiters and brown bear hunters in the same area
- No conservation concerns with either the existing or proposed baiting dates
  - The high brown bear mortality has been corrected
- 56% of baited black bear harvest occurs during period that baiting would be closed
- Would expect black bear harvest over bait to decline
   June 1-15 because bait could not go out until June 1





Snowfall —Avg. Snowfall 1949-2013 (Western Regional Climate Center)







#### Discussion

- Little known about the 5B moose population
  - Surveys infrequent due to weather, snow condition, and limited aircraft availability
  - Moose densities are believed to be low
- Unit 5B was last surveyed in 2007
  - 82 total moose (16% calves)
  - Herd composition not available due to late timing of survey

#### Discussion

- Access is by boat or aircraft only
  - Difficult due to weather and distance across Yakutat Bay
- Total 57 bulls harvested (2004-2013)
  - Avg 6 bulls/year
  - Approximately 38 people obtain registration permits per year, and on average 20 people hunt, with a success rate of 30%.
- Earlier season shift likely to increase harvest
  - RM062 would open earlier than any other moose hunt in SE AK, and Unit 6
  - Existing harvest level appropriate for this area





#### Discussion

- Migratory Bird Treaty Act of 1918 (MBTA) governs the establishment of waterfowl hunting seasons
- The MBTA framework requires states to select season dates (max. 107 days) between Sept. 1 and Mar. 10.
- The proposed Aug. 15 start date falls outside the allowable MBTA framework dates
- Therefore, State lacks authority to implement
