EXPLANATION:

This emergency order closes the resident and nonresident mountain goat hunting season in the Upper Blue Lake Zone on Baranof Island in Game Management Unit 4. This emergency order takes effect at 11:59 PM, October 12, 2017.


REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5 AAC 85.040, Hunting seasons and bag limits for goat**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

Units and Bag Limits	Resident Open Season (Subsistence and General Hunts	Nonresident Open Season
(1) ... Unit 4, Upper Blue Lake - Drainages of north fork Blue Lake Creek, east of the Glacier Lake outflow, east of south fork Blue Lake Creek and north of Baranof Pass (west side Mt. Bassie).	Aug. 1 – Oct. 12 (General hunt only)	Aug. 1 – Oct. 12
1 goat by registration permit only, the taking of nannies with kids is prohibited. ...		

All other mountain goat hunting regulations in Unit 4 remain unchanged and are not affected by this emergency order.

JUSTIFICATION:

Management biologists set a maximum harvest quota of two male goats or one female for the Upper Blue Lake Zone of the Unit 4 registration mountain goat hunt on Baranof Island (RG150). Quotas were calculated from 2015 and 2016 survey results. The limit of one female was set to encourage harvest of males and has been a successful strategy, allowing hunters more opportunity and lowering the risk of localized overharvest. As of Monday, October 9, 2017, two male goats have been reported harvested. Because the maximum harvest quota has been met in this zone, an emergency order is being issued to close this zone to mountain goat hunting at 11:59 pm, Thursday, October 12, 2017.

This emergency order is necessary to restrict the harvest to the maximum sustainable level and prevent overharvest in this zone. Any additional harvest could have long-term negative effects on this goat population.
