EXPLANATION:

This emergency order changes the season closure date for the Nelchina caribou herd hunts RC561, RC562, and CC001. Winter harvest for Nelchina hunts has fulfilled the winter harvest quota.

REGULATION:

Therefore, the provisions of **5AAC 85.025 (a)(8)(B), Hunting Seasons and Bag Limits for Caribou**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective:

JUSTIFICATION:

To maintain the herd within the population objective of 35,000–40,000 Nelchina caribou, harvest quotas are modified annually based on the harvestable surplus of the herd. For regulatory year 2020/21, more than 3,800 animals were available for state harvest from the Nelchina herd and more than 400 animals were expected to be harvested in federal hunts. During the fall hunting season, the herd remained scattered and difficult to access which resulted in lower than typical harvest rates. The state fall seasons for all Unit 13 caribou hunts were extended providing additional opportunity from September 21–30. Less than 2,500 caribou were harvested during the fall hunts.

Fall composition surveys indicated that calf survival in the spring/early summer was low in the 2020 season. Low calf numbers reduced the fall population estimate to the lower end of the population objectives, but a surplus of adult caribou remained in the herd. As planned, subsistence hunts and DC485 reopened on October 21st with an overall winter quota of 1,100 caribou for state harvest. DC485 closed on January 10th to allow subsistence hunts to harvest the remaining quota. Subsistence harvest has since fulfilled the winter quota.
