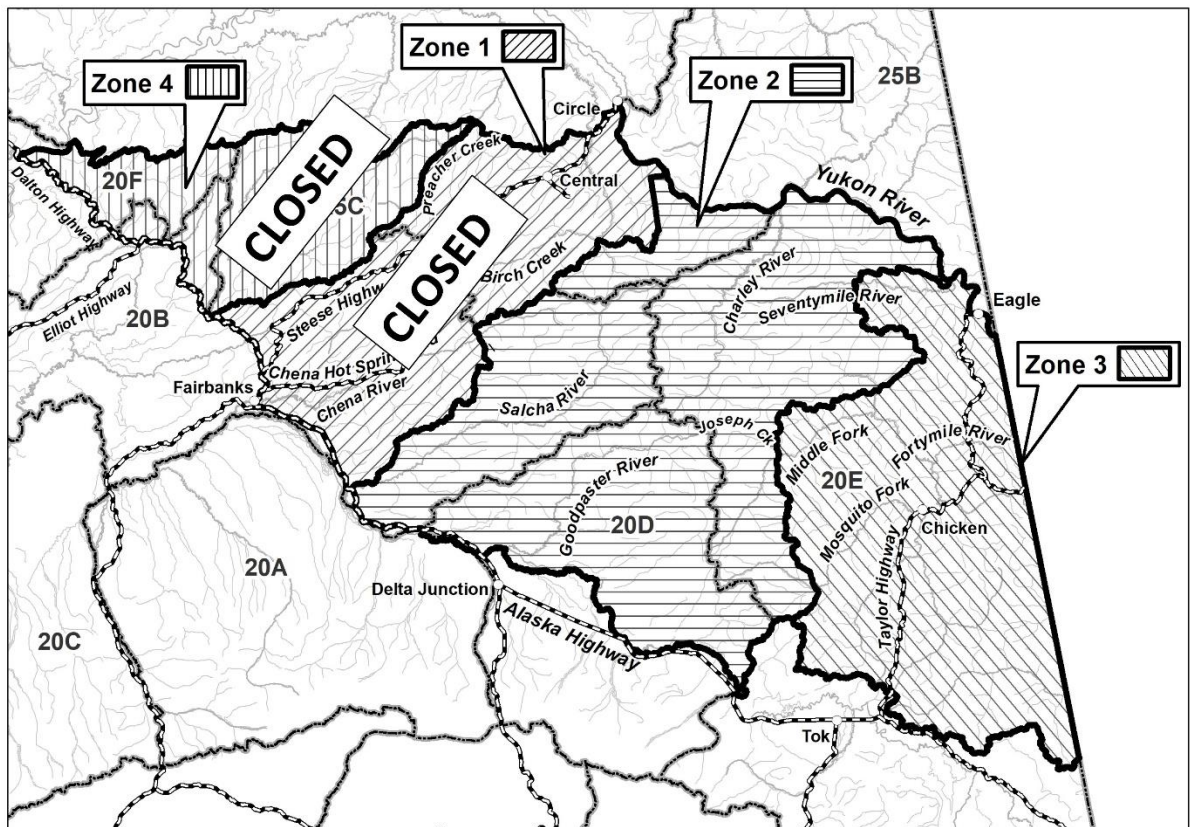

EXPLANATION:

State registration permit hunt RC867 for the Fortymile Caribou Herd is divided into 4 zones. This emergency order closes the hunt in Zones 1 and 4 of the Fortymile Caribou hunt area, located in portions of Game Management Units 20B, 20F, and 25C.

No other caribou hunting regulations in Units 20 and 25 are affected by this emergency order.



REGULATION:

Therefore, the following regulations in **5AAC 85.025(a)(15) and (20), HUNTING SEASONS AND BAG LIMITS FOR CARIBOU**, are superseded by this emergency order, and the following provisions are effective for hunting caribou:

All other caribou hunting regulations in Units 20 and 25 are not affected by this emergency order.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Alaska Board of Game endorsed the Fortymile Caribou Herd Harvest Plan as a means of guiding harvest of the herd. The annual harvest quota is allocated seasonally: 75% to the fall hunt and 25% to the winter hunt. The winter harvest quota is further subdivided into zones within the

RC867 registration hunt area, each with its own quota. The winter 2023 combined quota for Zones 1 and 4 is 105 caribou. Fortymile caribou are plentiful near the Steese highway in Zones 1 and 4, and we expect the harvest quota to be exceeded in less than a day if opened as scheduled on October 27, 2023, in Zones 1 and 4. As a conservation measure, the RC867 hunt in Zones 1 and 4 will be delayed until caribou numbers near the Steese highway decrease enough to avoid overharvest of the herd. A season opening will be announced in these Zones if this occurs. The state caribou hunting season (RC867) will open in Zones 2 and 3 on October 27, 2023 as scheduled.
