#### Miscellaneous Business

- 1. Format of advisory committee reports/minutes:
  - Board will develop recommendations regarding minute format during the October 2013 Work Session. Board will discuss minute format at the October 2013 Joint Board meeting.
- 2. Swanson Lagoon sockeye salmon stock of concern:
  - In reference to RC #6, summary of recommendation establishing a stock of management concern for Swanson River sockeye salmon, and RC #7, Swanson Lagoon sockeye salmon stock status and action plan, 2012.
  - The board concurred with the department's recommendation to establish Swanson Lagoon sockeye salmon as a management concern.
- 3. Board-generated Proposal A for Swanson Lagoon with regulatory language in RC 39:
  - In RC 7, the board stepped through recommended actions, starting with the commercial fishery.
  - In the commercial fishery, department supported Action 2 in RC 7, to rescind weekly commercial fishing periods and open only by emergency order (EO).
  - In the subsistence fishery, the department stated the intent is not to change any subsistence fishing regulations except by EO in case of conservation concern. Department recommended status quo.
  - Board indicated intent that no restrictions to subsistence fishery prior to restrictions to other fisheries.
  - In the sport fishery, the department recommended status quo.

- o The board moved to close the sport fishery and open only by EO.
- o Discussion of setting a Sustainable Escapement Threshold for Swanson Lagoon sockeye.
- O Department has yet to develop a meaningful process for developing SETs due to identifying specific stocks in a mixed stock fishery.
- o Clarification that the closure to the sport fishery was to close it for salmon, not for other species.
  - Roll call vote: C/A 7-0.

#### 4. Board-generated proposal policy:

• Draft on the web; Boards Support will issue a public notice consisting of a deadline for the public to comment on the Board-generated Proposal Criteria and will provide a summary of any received comments at the March 2013 Statewide meeting. No objection by the board.

#### 5. Placeholder proposals:

- Mentioning public process and comment concerns, Johnstone queried the board regarding a draft policy to be presented at the October 2013 Work Session regarding placeholder proposals.
- In addition, "in cycle" ACRs will be added to the agenda for the board's October 2013 Work Session. No objection by the board.

## 6. PowerPoint presentations during public testimony:

- The board suggested PowerPoint presentations need to be RC'd, and be included in the time limit for public testimony. It was also instructed to public that the PowerPoint be given to staff and included in the time limit.
- It was also suggested adding to the October 2013 Work Session meeting to make a recommendation to the Joint Boards; no objection by the board.

# 7. Update on Cordova meeting logistics for the 2014/12015 Prince William Sound and Upper Copper/Upper Susitna finfish meeting:

- A discussion took place of waiting for the October 2013 Work Session to definitively schedule the meeting at the Cordova Convention center, which is not yet completed and for which the community has requested funding.
- Discussion of the renovated elementary school facility as a fall-back.
- Board requested staff visit Cordova to check out the facilities and logistics and report back to the March 2013 Statewide meeting.

### 8. Upper Cook Inlet Task Force update:

- RC 172 was discussed.
- Edits to RC 172 was expressed of separating the task force's authority and the board's authority as the board views RC 172 as input and ideas for discussion, not recommendations. The board prefers keeping language that reflects RC 172 contains actions to be voted on by the board, and not actions simply for a vote of endorsement and asked Boards Support to clarify the document.
