Finding language for Proposal 237

5 AAC 02.466 is amended to read:

## **OPTION A.**

5 AAC 02.466. Customary and traditional subsistence uses of shellfish fish stocks and amount necessary for subsistence uses. (a) The Alaska Board of Fisheries (board) finds that the following shellfish stocks are customary and traditionally taken or used for subsistence:

(1) king crab in the Kodiak Area, as described in 5 AAC 02.400, except for the Semidi Island Overlap, the North Mainland, and the South Mainland Sections, as described in 5 AAC 35.505(a);

(2) <u>Tanner crab</u>, Dungeness crab, shrimp, and miscellaneous shellfish, [on-the south side of the Alaska Peninsula between Kilokak Rocks 156° 19' W. long. and Cape Kumlik 157° 27' W. long.] in the Kodiak Area, as described in 5 AAC 02.400;

(b)

(1) <u>The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX king crab is reasonably necessary for subsistence</u> <u>purposes in the Kodiak Area, except for the Semidi Island Overlap, the North Mainland,</u> and the South Mainland Sections, as described in 5 AAC 35.505(a);

(2) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX Tanner crab is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area;

(3) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX Dungeness crab is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area;

(4) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX pounds of usable weight of miscellaneous shellfish is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area;

(5) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX pounds of usable weight of shrimp is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area.

(6) The boards finds that 22,000 - 68,000 pounds of usable weight of Dungeness crab and miscellaneous shellfish is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes on the south side of

the Alaska Peninsula between Kilokak Rocks 156° 19' W. long. and Cape Kumlik 157° 27' W. long. [the area described in (a)(2) of this section] and in 5 AAC 02.500, combined.

## **OPTION B.**

5 AAC 02.466. Customary and traditional subsistence uses of shellfish fish stocks and amount necessary for subsistence uses. (a) The Alaska Board of Fisheries (board) finds that the following shellfish stocks are customary and traditionally taken or used for subsistence: king crab, <u>Tanner crab</u>, <u>Dungeness crab</u>, <u>shrimp</u>, <u>and miscellaneous shellfish are customarily</u> <u>and traditionally used for subsistence in the Kodiak Area</u>. except for the Semidi Island Overlap, the North Mainland, and the South Mainland Sections, as described in 5 AAC 35.505(a);

(2) Dungeness erab and miscellaneous shellfish, on the south side of the Alaska Peninsula between Kilokak Rocks 156° 19' W. long. and Cape Kumlik 157° 27' W. long.

(b)

(1) <u>The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX king crab is reasonably necessary for subsistence</u> purposes in the Kodiak Area;

(2) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX Tanner crab is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area;

(3) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX Dungeness crab is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area;

(4) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX pounds of usable weight of miscellaneous shellfish is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area;

(5) The board finds that X,XXX – X,XXX pounds of usable weight of shrimp is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes in the Kodiak Area.

(6) The boards finds that 22,000 – 68,000 pounds of usable weight of Dungeness crab and miscellaneous shellfish is reasonably necessary for subsistence purposes <u>on the south side of</u> the Alaska Peninsula between Kilokak Rocks 156° 19' W. long. and Cape Kumlik 157° 27' W. long. [the area described in (a)(2) of this section] and in 5 AAC 02.500, combined.
