












# Galena Area Management Strategy Development

#### RM832

- Koyukuk River Moose Management Plan (1999-2000)
  - Rural, Urban, Commercial operators consensus
  - Federal Agencies
  - Endorsed by FSB and BOG in 2002
  - Proposals, Lawsuits, Potential Closures (i.e. Kanuti CUA)
  - OBJECTIVES: Growth, 30B:100C, reduce crowding, keep opportunity RM834
- KRAC, MYAC, RAC, WIRAC support in 2004







### **Management Dilemma**


- High Proportion of Federal Land
- High Density Population (High Sustainable Harvest, High Trophy Value)
- High Demand/Notoriety (non-local residents)
- Population decline, bull:cow ratio decline


Problem: How do we keep the large resident hunter demand from exceeding sustainable harvest, without going into a Tier hunt or turning it over to Federal Management.

Solution: Apply a management tool that delineates hunters without affecting reasonable opportunity.













# **Other Regulations**


- Closed cow seasons
- Koyukuk and Nowitna Checkstations
- Meat on the bone of 4 quarters and ribs
- Salvage entire head (repealed 2010)
- 13 Drawing permit areas in Galena Mgt Area
- Resident and Non-resident locking tags
- Drawing Permit hunters not eligible for RM832/RM834
- Split season dates within the KCUA
- No proxy hunting on Drawing Permits






































### **Management Program - Summary**

- Reduced harvest on river corridors
- Improved hunter distribution
- Improved bull:cow ratios (esp. corridors)
- Fall harvest is improved for local hunters
- Reduced demand of local hunters for winter harvest, therefore fewer cows harvested
- Population stable
- Harvest opportunity increasing in KCUA
- Choice for Resident hunters is maintained with Drawing Permit opportunity
- Illegal guiding reduced

### Limited Registration Permit "Models"

- Limited by vendor location (where)
- Limited by distribution timing (when)
- · Limit by number of permits
- Concurrent Registration Permits
- Hunt conditions

  - Other Permit Hunts Restricted
  - Other hunts conditions

### **Limited Registration Permit Option**

#### **Effect**

- Limits reasonable opportunity for local residents (e.g. firefighters, north slope workers, etc.)
- Limits reasonable opportunity of non-local residents
- Eliminates all nonresident opportunity
- Administration is costprohibitive (10 villages), logistically impractical
- · Public disapproval

#### **Outcome**

#### Tier II:

- ANS determinations
- Eliminate nonresident opportunity
- Federal response

#### **Federal intervention:**

- Reporting data, season alignment
- Management control (i.e. Sustainability, Mgt. objectives, enforcement)
- Reallocation of resource

### **Early Season Hunt Option**

#### **Effect**

- Warm fall weather (esp. recently)
- Repeated requests for Emergency seasons
- Low hunter success
- Conflict with other summer activities (e.g. fall chum run, firefighting)
- Low hunter interest
- Not a disincentive

• Federal intervention (GMU 21B – 9/26-10/1; GMU 24C/D – 9/26-10/1)

## **Brown Bear (RB601) – Summary**

#### **Disincentive**

- Hide and claws if taken out of GMU
- Salvage all meat
- Permit in advance (vs. Gen. Harv.)

#### Incentive

- No sealing required
- Tag fee exempt (no tag fee in RIII)

#### **Participation**

• 86 hunters - 4 bears; in last 7 years

# Antler Destruction a "victim" of it's own Success

- Increased bull:cow ratios have led to the perception of abundance (i.e. no need for antler cutting regulation)
- Good cohorts of 2003-05 are now 50"-60" bulls means more large bulls now in harvest (hunters didn't have as much problem with regulation when they were cutting 30"-40" bulls)
- With time, people have forgotten about number of hunters, low numbers, hunter conflicts, declining population
- With more moose being harvested, more hunters are being challenged with the need to comply

### Potential Outcomes with Eliminating Trophy Destruction Tool

- Increase in number of hunters
- Decline in Bull:Cow ratios
- Increase in hunter conflicts
- Harvest will exceed sustainability

#### Response

- Restrictive regulation (seasons length, antler restrictions, CUA's, etc.)
- Tier II (no Non-res.), Federal hunts,
   Federal closures, Law suits
- Decreased State authority for management

# **Department Recommendation:**

Retain Discretionary Permit Management tool for trophy nullification
