

Koyukuk Controlled Use Area

The Koyukuk Controlled Use Area includes those portions of Unit 21 and 24 bounded by a line from the north bank of the Yukon River at Koyukuk at 64°52.58' N lat., 157°43.10' W long., then north-erly to the confluence of the Honnosa and Katele Rivers at 65° 28.42' N lat., 157°44.89' W long., then northeasterly to the confluence of Billy Hawk Creek and the Huslia River at 65° 56.66' N lat., 156° 40.81' W long., then easterly to the confluence of the Dakli River at 66° 02.56' N lat., 156° 12.71' W long., then easterly to the confluence of McLanes Creek and the Hogatza River at 66° 00.31' N lat., 155° 18.57' W long., then easterly to the middle of the Hughes airstrip at 66° 02.56' N lat., 154° 15.69' W long., then south to Little Indian River at 65° 47.10' N lat., 154° 15.69' W long., then southwest to the crest of Hochanodochla Mountain at 65° 31.87' N lat., 154°52.18' W long., then southwest to the mouth of Cottonwood Creek at 65° 13.00' N lat., 156° 06.43' W long., then southwest to Bishop Rock (Yistletaw) at 64° 49.35' N lat., 157°21.73' W long., then westerly along the north bank of the Yukon River (including Koyukuk Island) to the point of beginning.

The area is closed to the use of aircraft for hunting moose, including transportation of moose hunters, their hunting gear, or moose parts; however, this does not apply to transportation of moose hunters, their hunting gear or moose parts by aircraft between publicly owned airports in the controlled use area or the transportation into the area of game meat that has been processed for human consumption.

All permit holders must sign in at the ADF&G check station or Huslia or Hughes to activate the hunt dates indicated on the permit, and must report in person at the ADF&G check station or Huslia or Hughes within 48 hours of the close of the season for which the permit was issued.

Moose Units 21 & 24 (Koyukuk Controlled Use Area)

- In ALL Unit 21 and Unit 24 moose hunts, the front quarter, hindquarter, and rib meat must remain on the bone until the meat has been transported from the field or to the hunter's home.
- You may not apply for any 2014 Koyukuk Controlled Use Area (CUA) moose drawing hunts if you were drawn for any 2013 Koyukuk CUA moose drawing hunts.
- A hunter who is issued a drawing permit for hunt areas in Units 21C, 21D, and 24 cannot receive Registration Permit RM832 or RM834.**
- All unsuccessful hunters and those who did not hunt must report within 15 days of close of season.**

Moose Units 21 & 24 (Galena Area Permit Hunts)

- In ALL Unit 21 and Unit 24 moose hunts, the front quarter, hindquarter, and rib meat must remain on the bone until the meat has been transported from the field or to the hunter's home.
- You may not apply for any 2014 Koyukuk Controlled Use Area (CUA) moose drawing hunts if you were drawn for any 2013 Koyukuk CUA moose drawing hunts.
- A hunter who is issued a drawing permit for hunt areas in Units 21C, 21D, and 24 cannot receive Registration Permit RM832 or RM834.**
- All unsuccessful hunters and those who did not hunt must report within 15 days of close of season.**
