I strongly oppose the hunting of moose at Kincaid Park in Anchorage. I am a frequent user of Kincaid Park at all times of the year. October is a special time to use the park, as in recent years snow has yet to fall and jogging and trail use is exceptional - the leaves are down and views are open. If the snow falls, cross country skiing begins.

Moose are part of the reason for visiting and enjoying the park. Through the 18 years I have used Kincaid, I have never had a problem with moose. If a moose is on a trail, I use good judgment on whether to try to pass, or turn around and take another route. My use includes both the ski trails and the bike trails.

Allowing hunts in October, or any month, will be dangerous to park users. Do not take the chance of someone being shot by hunters bullets or shot. Likewise, using motorized vehicles on the ski trails will ruin them.

Do not allow hunting in Kincaid Park. Thank you.
