Alaska Joint Board of Game and Board of Fisheries Committee Members,

The Mat Valley Fish and Game Advisory Committee discussed matters pertaining to the Joint Board Committee Meeting planned for December 9th and would like to apprise the Joint Board of its recommendations.

AC members feel that the Boards of Fish and Game should not lengthen meeting cycles. AC members believe that biological data, and management tools need to be reviewed and assessed on a more frequent basis than every 4-5 years. Stakeholders should have an opportunity to weigh-in on management decisions that may adversely effect a resource or user group, and have a venue to do so within a reasonable amount of time.

Advisory Committee members recommend a strict adherence to the criteria for developing board generated proposals as this will in turn save money for stake holders, and the State. AC members referenced the recent board generated proposals regarding sheep, and the subsequent time and money being invested as a result.

AC members recognize the need to create budget savings and hope to continue to weigh in on ideas as they are introduced.
